In his career Broderick administered three University's art programs. At UTSA he served as Division Director of Art and Architecture, Department Chair of Art and Art History and founding Chairman of the University's Public Art Commission. As past President, Fellow, and Life Member of the National Association of Schools of Art and Design, he continues to serve the Association and the national higher education art and design community in a number of capacities including onsite Program Evaluator, Consultant,

and Accreditation Visit Team Director on campuses, now numbering over seventy institutions. He also regularly serves as an independent administrative and planning consultant to universities and independent colleges of art and design. A member of the National Council of Art Administrators (NCAA) since 1971, Broderick has actively served on the NCAA Board of Directors and has planned, organized, and co-hosted two of their National Conferences. He has also served on the Boards of Directors of The Texas Association of Schools of Art and The Texas Art Education Association. For four years he served the Art Discipline Screening Committee for Senior Fulbright Scholar awards through the Council for International Exchange of Scholars.
